<p>ITEM 5 – GREEN HOWARDS ASSOCIATION ACCOUNTS</p>	
<p>7. Copies of the Association Balance Sheet for the year ending 31 Dec 13, were made available to members. They were presented and explained by the Treasurer, Major Pat Ralph. The Accounts had been adopted at the GHA Executive Meeting held at Richmond on 5 Apr 14.</p>	
<p>8. The Treasurer explained the Income and Expenditure, stating that the reason for the overspend, was due to Richmond Sunday, the reduction in the price of the Reunion tickets and the trip to America for the celebration of the Shanghai Mace.</p>	
<p>ITEM 6 – YORKSHIRE REGIMENT BENEVOLENT FUND (YBF)</p>	
<p>9. Major Ralph reported that The YBF continues to look after Green Howards benevolence interests. He reported that over the last six months, the YBF had paid out £37.000 on 147 cases, and on a broader view; from Apr 13 to Apr 14, £85.000 has been released on 275 cases. The Treasurer confirmed that Green Howards, who fall into difficulty, continue to be well supported by the fund.</p>	
<p>ITEM 7 – YORKSHIRE REGIMENT MATTERS</p>	
<p>10. Maj Ralph gave the following update on the Yorkshire Regiment:</p>	
<p>10.1 Regimental Headquarters.</p>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Regimental Secretary is Lt Col David O’Kelly (Green Howards); • Recruiting has now been taken over by Col Mark Lodge; • The post of Assistant Regimental Secretary to Area HQ (South) has now been taken on by Maj Charlie Helmn (Green Howards). 	
<p>10.2 Museum at RHQ in York. The museum will be called the York Army Museum and is presently undergoing a £1M refurbishment. The museum will be a combination of the Yorkshire Regiment Dragoon Guards and the Yorkshire Infantry. An opening date has not yet been set as work has been delayed for various reasons.</p>	
<p>10.3 1 YORKS – Warminster.</p>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Still carrying out the duties of a Demonstration Battalion. Recently returned from BATUS after a successful training period, in preparation to take over the role of the Armoured Infantry Lead Battle Group. 	

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<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • They are doing very well on the sports scene and this year were the Army Rugby champions. <p>10.4 2 YORKS – Cyprus.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Theatre Reserve Battalion until 5 Nov 14, when they handover to another Battalion. • In August the CO and 42 officers and soldiers deployed to Iraq to report to the MOD on what assistance the British Army could give. As a result, twelve 2 YORKS soldiers were sent out to train Iraq soldiers on heavy weapons. • In Aug 15, 2 YORKS will move to Somme Barracks in Catterick, taking over a Light Role, supported by 4 YORKS. The Reserve Army will train with the Regulars and be available for future deployments with them. • This year they came third in the Army Novice boxing Championships. <p>10.5 4 YORKS – RHQ in York.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recruiting is very slow at the moment and numbers are low. • The Battalion will have a split Annual Camp with 50% to Germany and the other 50% deploying to Cyprus in Nov 14. • The CO and a team went to Uganda to help train the Ugandan Defence Force.

The President spoke on the following matters:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Green Howards Association, the museum, the Friends and the Green Howards wider family were in very good order. The new Governance had been agreed for the future and we are looking forward to extend our links with the Yorkshire Regiment overtime. • The Regimental funds are in a healthy position. • The Green Howards Museum, explaining the amount of work that had gone into the redevelopment and confirming that the name of the museum will remain The Green Howards Museum. • The re-opening of the museum, with members and donors invited to a drinks evening on Sat 8 Nov and a Soft Opening on Sun 9 Nov. (After note: completed successfully). The Official Opening will be on Sun 10 May 15, tying in with Richmond Sunday. The Official Opening will be by a VIP still to be confirmed. • The proposed format for Richmond Sunday on 10 May 15. 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<p>ITEM 9 – EVENTS FOR 2015</p> <p>12. The Chairman briefed members on the following main events for 2015:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • GHA Executive Meeting on Sat 11 Apr, explaining that in future he would like to try the possibility of moving the meeting to other Branch locations. However, in 2015 it will remain in Richmond and the meeting will be followed with a trip around the museum for those who had not yet seen the redevelopment. The Chairman informed members that they were all welcome to attend the Executive Meeting. • Richmond Sunday and the Official Opening of the Museum on Sun 10 May. • FGHM AGM date has not been fixed yet, as the Committee is waiting until after the re-opening of the museum. • Officers’ Dinner will be in London on Fri 6 Nov, in a hotel to avoid hire charges. The date was selected to tie in with Remembrance Sunday for those who wish to stay on. The Chairman also explained that it is becoming very expensive to run the number of dinners and lunches and this will have to be looked at for the future. • It is planned to have the Reunion over the weekend 16-18 Oct in Scarborough. <p>18. Point Raised By Mr Pip Elliot. Mr Elliot raised a point regarding the location and future value given to the Green Howards property and silver. He was also concerned about future rebranding of the museum and the fact that the Yorkshire Regiment badge appears on the centre room floor of the museum.</p>	
<p>19. Response by the President and Brig Powell. The President said there would be no rebranding to the museum name. He reminded everyone that the Regiment had previously been known as the Yorkshire Regiment. The merger it is part of our history; we must take that into the future. Brig Powell added that the public must be reminded that the Green Howards merged, did not disband, and that the Yorkshire Regiment must be part of our future. He also said that it is important that the Green Howards name lives on in the Yorkshire Regiments messes, hence the need for part of our property and silver collections to be in those locations. The President further explained the procedure and dispersal of the Regimental property and silver and we now had control of it, including the Scarborough Shield. The President concluded by asking members to spread the word that the Trustees were totally committed in carrying the Green Howards name on for as long as possible, but we must support the Yorkshire Regiment and its soldiers as we go forward.</p>	All
